

What do you do now? Look for ideas below.

Write your own ideas for preparing, doing, and sharing in the open areas.

Preparing

During a political campaign, get the information you need to decide who to vote for. Then watch the results.

Create a family scrapbook that shows your family tree and includes things each member has done.

Interview family members about your heritage.

Think of questions you would like to ask of a politician. Interview him or her to get the answers to these questions.

Make a list of the politicians who represent you. Write to them and let them know that you are interested in their voting record.

Run for an office in your club, church group, or school.

Visit your county courthouse, the state capitol, or our national capitol and learn who does what.

Think of and do a project that has to do with serving your community.

Make a list of the ways in which someone can become a citizen of the United States. Then talk with people who got their citizenship in these ways.

When you go on a vacation, keep a journal that includes information about the history of the area you visit.

Read a local newspaper from another community. Are the problems they are dealing with different or the same as the problems in your community.

Doing

Report to your town board, mayor's office, or county commissioners about your work for the community through 4-H, your school, or other group.

Host an international student.

Hold a neighborhood block party and meet the other people who live around you.
